

**MINUTES OF MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF
ACHIEVEPOINT FLORIDA, INC.
February 24, 2026**

A meeting of the Governing Board of AchievePoint Florida, Inc. was held on Tuesday, February 24, 2026, at 4:30 PM. The meeting took place simultaneously at all AchievePoint Florida locations, including Andrews High School, C.G. Bethel High School, Chambers High School, Main Street High School, Palm Beach Preparatory Charter Academy, Palm Beach Preparatory Charter Academy Middle School and Sandra Marie Curtis High School.

The meeting was called to order at 4:30 p.m. by Board Chair, Mr. Rob Sparks. Mr. Sparks conducted the roll call, and Ms. Nia Bridges recorded the minutes. Following roll call, Chair Sparks noted that Mr. Ira Paul, Mr. Jeff Mayer, and Ms. Viki Hucke-McCright were in attendance. Dr. Melissa Harts was absent during roll call and joined the meeting at 4:49 p.m. A quorum was present.

To begin the meeting, the Chair requested approval of the agenda. On a motion by Mr. Paul, seconded by Ms. Hucke-McCright, the Board unanimously approved the agenda. Following this, on a motion by Ms. Hucke-McCright, seconded by Mr. Paul, the Board unanimously approved the consent items as presented in the published agenda.

There were no requests for public comment.

The Chair then moved to the Legislative section of the agenda. Mr. Tony Arza presented a legislative update. No action was required by the Board.

The Chair next proceeded to Governance matters. Mr. Jeff Wood was recognized; however, there were no governance items presented for discussion or action.

The Chair then transitioned to the School Operations report. Dr. Eunice Casey presented an operational update, including follow-up on benchmark assessment practices. She explained that schools administer state FAST assessments (PM1, PM2, PM3), along with internal benchmarks such

as NWEA, Reading Plus, and Renaissance Star, depending on the campus. These assessments are used to guide targeted interventions through the MTSS framework.

Dr. Casey also reviewed graduation rate data for the 2024–2025 school year, noting that all schools exceeded typical expectations for at-risk populations, with several campuses achieving rates above 50% and Andrews High School reaching 80%. She emphasized the challenges associated with serving highly transient, credit-deficient students while still achieving positive outcomes.

She further presented enrollment and FTE data from the February reporting window. Total enrollment was reported at approximately 2,581 students, reflecting a slight increase over the prior year average, while noting that challenges remain at certain campuses related to enrollment and attendance.

Dr. Casey also reported that Andrews High School received a recommendation for charter renewal for an additional five-year term through June 30, 2031.

The Board engaged in discussion regarding assessment participation, graduation cohort timelines, and instructional support. No vote was required.

Following the operations report, each principal provided updates on school performance, enrollment, attendance, academic initiatives, and student engagement efforts. Highlights included the continued implementation of targeted instruction and intervention programs, growth in Career and Technical Education (CTE) program participation, ongoing efforts to improve attendance and student engagement, strong academic performance indicators across several campuses, and expanded student support initiatives such as mentoring, boot camps, and Saturday school programs. No Board action was required following these reports.

The Chair then moved to Technology Investments. Mr. Gregg Rosann presented an update on technology infrastructure improvements across campuses. Key initiatives include upgrading internet reliability through dedicated fiber lines, replacing outdated network equipment, enhancing web filtering systems, and deploying new student devices at select campuses. Implementation is currently underway, with completion targeted prior to the next school year. No Board action was required.

The Chair then proceeded to Financial Matters. Ms. Michelle Schmitt provided a financial update, noting that while enrollment was slightly below projections, resulting in reduced funding in some areas, overall revenue is expected to exceed the revised budget due to increases in local capital improvement funds and referendum revenues.

She reviewed funding variances across schools and explained that the additional revenues will support operational needs and strategic investments. The Board discussed enrollment variances and ongoing efforts to improve tracking of student retention and recruitment metrics. No vote was required.

With no further discussion, the meeting was adjourned by Board Chair, Rob Sparks, at 5:40 p.m.
